
# 🧕 IOANNA FOKA







In their games together they invent thousands of enchanting stories. And they would do much more if the adults didn't stop them.



Petros' Long Walk

PUBLISHED IN ENGLISH, FRENCH, GERMAN, ITALIAN, RUSSIAN, DANISH, NORWEGIAN Petros, aged nine, is sad because his pet cricket has died and he is looking for somewhere to bury it. But he doesn't manage to do bury his pet. The very next morning his mother wakes him abruptly: "Get up and get dressed. There's a war on. Can't you hear the sirens?" It is 28 October, 1940. We follow Petros on his long walk, which is full of real-life adventures, from October 1940 to October 1944, when Greece is liberated.



#### Wild Cat Under Glass

PUBLISHED IN ENGLISH, FRENCH, RUSSIAN, DANISH, FINNISH, ITALIAN It is 1937. Melia and Myrto are two girls who live on an Aegean island. Instead of telling them fairy tales, their father regales them with the myths and legends of the ancient Greeks. Their cousin Nikos, a student from Athens, enchants them with the story of a tiger - a "kaplani" as it is called on the island - which has been stuffed and is kept in a display case in their living-room. The children and the adults gradually become involved in the story of the tiger in the display case, after something that happens in the heat of summer, in early August.







# ALKI ZEI

Constantina and her Spiders

Speaking of best-selling Greek writers of fiction for children and adolescents, one of the few names that comes to mind is that of Alki Zei. For many years a favourite of children (and apparently also of their parents), she has returned with yet another novel that tackles a genuinely tough contemporary topic, the drugs, in a unique, sensitive and sensible way.

Constantina and her Spiders won the Greek IBBY prize for the best book for teenagers, and Alki Zei has been nominated as a candidate for the 2004 Hans Christian Andersen Award for Writing and Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award for Literature.
